	WRITE A DRAFT OF YOUR PERSONAL ESSAY  Most scholarship applications require a personal essay, and many colleges require one as well.  Including a personal essay will support your application. Your essay will help you to stand out from other applicants. Find free help with topics, brainstorming, essay structure and more here: The College Essay Guy			
	Use tools such as the online FAFSA 4caster to help calculate how much financial aid you will receive and to estimate your Expected Family Contribution (EFC). Since scholarship deadlines are usually at the same time each year, you can use your junior year to find and save scholarships for which you may be eligible.
